# HTA WORKING GROUP SURVEY REPORT

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


#### **BACKGROUND**

- □ HTA WG mandate includes capacity building for the conduct of postauthorisation studies (PAS) that in tandem meet the needs of regulators and HTA bodies
- □ The ENCePP-HTA WG survey was a collaborative exercise in mapping existing ENCePP experience in undertaking such studies
- ☐ The survey was designed to identify
  - ✓ Current experience within the network of including HTA outcomes in post authorization pharmacoepidemiological research
  - ✓ Potential areas for HTA skills enhancement
- □ 139 ENCePP centres were invited to complete an on line survey comprising 21 questions in 2Q 2014




## PROFILE OF RESPONDING CENTRES (N = 35)



Responses from across the spectrum of ENCePP centres




## STUDIES PERFORMED WITH HTA OUTCOMES (N = 32)



A small number of centres performed a high proportion of studies




# EFFECTIVENESS DATA COLLECTION (N = 26)



#### **Experience mostly with clinical and patient-reported outcomes**




## STUDY INVOLVEMENT (N = 24)

#### SUMMARY

Implications and actions arising from the survey need to be agreed by the working group however the results

- □ Confirm that an important proportion of ENCePP centres have experience in conducting studies with endpoints directly relevant to HTA
- ☐ Given the increasing interest in individual studies responding to both regulatory and HTA questions, ENCePP may be a useful platform to develop European capacity to deliver such studies.
- □ Indicate a level of experience which could support the development of a 'Good Practice' paper for conducting studies that include HTA and safety outcomes
- □ Provide an opportunity to assess if / how the ENCePP Research Resources Database might be updated to reflect individual centre competencies



#### PLANNED NEXT STEPS

Results will be used to inform approaches on building capacity, including through training
Building on the experience in conducting the survey – group has consolidated
Enhance group membership with increased involvement of individuals from HTA bodies
Increase awareness of ENCePP among HTA bodies
The results have been disseminated through ISPE and ISPOR and will be presented at EMA-EUnetHTA meeting December 2014
